Content Governance Joins AI as Important LavaCon Theme

There is a growing theme evident in this year's LavaCon presentations, and it's not Al. But it is a theme inescapably intertwined with Al.

Speaker after speaker touched on content governance. The theme of governance includes concepts such as content needing to be properly maintained, well versioned, and strictly provenanced.

For example, the opening featured speaker, Rob Hanna, talked about broken trust, saying "once we break people's trust in content, they won't even bother to look at it anymore."

Then Megan Gilhooly stated about governance, risk, and compliance "With the regulations out there, and with AI, we have to build privacy into our solutions."

Later in the day, Jeff Coyle tied governance to quality in his breakout session, saying "Quality isn't negotiable. Quality is trust, depth, and usefulness."

Yet over and over, the message also was that the best people to govern content are also the people who are best for creating content and best for structuring and tagging content for Al: the technical writers and documentation developers and content strategists who invested in attending LavaCon.

Tuesday gave conference attendees a last chance to talk with the more than 2 dozen sponsor vendors. Heretto gave away an espresso machine during the afternoon break, and Fluid Topics hosted a wine tasting following the day's sessions.
